

Physiologic Criteria

1. Traumatic arrest
2. Airway/respiratory compromise
3. Sustained BP < 90
4. GCS < 14
5. Blood transfusion in progress

Anatomic Criteria

6. Flail chest or major chest injury
7. Depressed skull fracture
8. Focal neurologic deficit (pupils, sensory, motor)
9. Abnormal abdominal exam
10. Major extremity vascular injury (arterial bleed, pulseless)
11. Two or more proximal long bone fractures (humerus, femur)
12. Amputation proximal to wrist or ankle

Mechanism of Injury Criteria

13. Major penetration to face/head
14. Gunshot or stab to torso (neck to groin)

Judgement Criteria

15. EMS judgement
16. Emergency physician judgement
